#### District Blitz Recap

Thank you so much to each of you who contributed financially and/or in prayer for our teens at District Blitz last weekend! Glenn Olson. the North Central District of the EFCA student ministries director shared this recap:

It is impossible to communicate or even know what God did during this weekend, but I would like to give you some snapshots of what I saw God doing.

#### Stats

- 2,924 attended from 95 Churches.
- 8 hours of optional prayer with 250, 750,1000, 1200, 1200 attending each of the prayer times. In the prayer room we only had 750 chairs which meant many were standing or sitting on the floor.
- 16 Seminars took place.
- The offering for clean water in Africa raised over \$11,423. The Well in Uganda needed \$10,500.
- Afternoon ministry projects cleaned 4 parks, helped 3 elementary schools, a homeless ministry and a foster ministry.

The first two rallies helped us realize the problem of sin. Then Saturday night was "the great exchange"... our sin for the righteousness of Christ and the joy that comes with the Gospel. Hundreds responded and then each youth group had students share in small groups.

A powerful thing happens when in a conference one third to half of the attendees are praying for 45 minutes before each session.

#### I have two favorite parts during the weekend...

- 1. The prayer times in which students and adults are talking to their Heavenly Father. In my heart I feel like God is saying to me "Thank you for putting together a place in which my kids are communicating with me... and me with them."
- 2. I love seeing all the small groups of students with an adult leader after each message gathering to discuss and process what they heard.


Family dinners/suppers are the best! They're such a great time of

#### 1. Just what are we talking about here?

Kost Family Dinners is a great way to meet folks from church that you may not already know. It's also a good way to get to know your church family better. Groups of 8 or so individuals will be formed. Those groups plan their own meals and get together once a month for 4-5 consecutive months. You share meals at participants' homes, at local restaurants, the church or wherever the group decides. The emphasis is on fun and fellowship, so you don't have to be a gourmet cook to participate.

#### 2. How does a Kost Family Dinners group work?

Simply fill out the registration form at the bottom of this sheet and put it in the offering plate or give it to Pastor Josh or Jen. Josh and Jen will put the groups together and connect with group leaders. The group leader will contact members to arrange the details for the first gathering. Dinner groups are encouraged to be creative in the meals they enjoy together. The group leader will plan future dinners with the members of the group, typically rotating hosts.

#### 3. What does the group leader do?

This is the point person for the group. The group leader contacts group members to select the location, date, and food sign-ups for the first gathering and planning future hosts/meals with the rest of the group.

#### 4. Who cooks the meals?

It's potluck! Usually the host will make the main dish, and other participants will bring coordinating sides or desserts. Potluck dinners are also a good way to simplify meal planning and distribute costs equally among everyone in the group. Consider picking a dinner "theme night" (i.e. Italian night, backyard barbeque, soup night, etc.), and everyone can bring a dish that goes along with that theme. Some groups may also choose to visit local restaurants or other venues.

#### 5. I don't have room to host a dinner, or I really can't cook!

Our desire is for you to spend time together getting to know each other and include everyone. Your group may choose to repeat a host home or host a dinner at church. We want everyone to feel that they can participate.

#### 6. What about families with children?

Your group will determine the answer here, bearing in mind that your preference for the kind of group you are interested in will have been taken into account initially. Please be sure to indicate your group type preference on the registration form.

#### 7. What will we talk about?

Anything and everything! The only question we'd highly recommend being a part of every gathering is, "How have you seen God at work in your life lately?"
